



Spring Luncheon With Guest Speaker Bonnie Dunbar

Join us for the 43rd annual Spring Luncheon featuring guest speaker, former astronaut and current CEO of the Museum of Flight, Dr. Bonnie Dunbar.

Dr. Dunbar is a Washington State native and was inspired by the early missions of Gagarin, Shepard, and Glenn. Her interest eventually led her into engineering, ultimately earning a Doctorate in mechanical biomedical engineering from the University of Houston. Dr. Dunbar held several research and engineering positions and, while at Rockwell, she helped to build the first Space Shuttle, *Columbia*. In 1978, she joined NASA and, in 1980, she was selected as a NASA Mission Specialist Astronaut.

Dr. Dunbar is a veteran of five spaceflight missions, logging 1,208 hours, more than 50 days, in orbit aboard the shuttles *Atlantis*, *Challenger*, *Columbia*, and *Endeavour*. She also trained in Russia, and was certified to fly in the Russian Soyuz Spacecraft.

She has held several NASA management assignments and now is the CEO of the Museum of Flight. Her current passion is helping to inspire the next generation of youth into science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) careers. The Museum of Flight provides one of the largest K-12 educational programs of any Air and Space Museum in the nation.

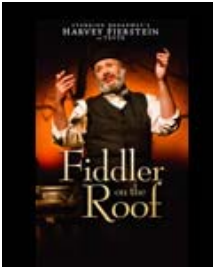

“Just as Giselle is ballet’s great tragedy, so Coppélia is its great comedy.” (George Balanchine)

PNB realizes a fond aspiration of Artistic Director Peter Boal with an all-new production of George Balanchine’s classic Coppélia (1974). Based on



Balanchine’s memories of the Russian production, and staged in close collaboration with the great dancer Alexandra Danilova, Coppélia has been called one

of the happiest ballets in existence. Much of its lasting appeal may be attributed to a melodiously beautiful score by French composer Léo Delibes, legendary for his ability to illustrate dance atmosphere and action.

For its new production, PNB has commissioned Italian scenic and costume designer Roberta Guidi di Bagno, whose enchanting conceptions were last admired by audiences of *The Merry Widow*.

Drawn from ballet’s Romantic period and informed by a 19th-century fascination with mechanical toys, Coppélia is the tale of vivacious young lovers, whose courtship is briefly interrupted when Doctor Coppélius, the village’s eccentric inventor, creates a doll so life-like that Franz becomes infatuated. When her suitor attempts a clandestine rendezvous, Swanilda evens the score by dressing as the doll and pretending to come to life. Ultimately, the pair is reconciled, and Act III’s effervescent wedding-day festivities, offer an array of spectacular dances.

Does Ginkgo Biloba Slow the Decline of Cognitive Function in Older Adults?

By George Gey, M.D., and Jeanette Dunn, Ed.D., R.N.

Ginkgo Biloba is an herb that has been used for years by many people to preserve memory and other mental functions. A recent study, called the Ginkgo Evaluation of Memory (GEM) failed to prove any benefits from Ginkgo.

The GEM study involved 3,069 community residents, ages 72-96, over six years, using a double blind placebo vs. 120 mg of the herb preparation taken twice a day. The mental tests were conducted at six academic centers across the USA. The tests were the Alzheimer Disease Assessment Scale (ADAS-Cog), attention, visual-spatial construction, language, and executive functions. Primary outcome was the rates of change over time.

There was no evidence that the herb slowed the usual progressive decline of mental functions tested over time. This research is important as these studies, as expensive as they are, have done little to reduce the excessive marketing and use of supplements. ❖
