NOAA Ship *Rainier* Tour

Gold Card members have a rare opportunity to tour the NOAA ship *Rainier*, one of the most modern and productive survey platforms of its type in the world. The *Rainier* will be in Seattle for two weeks in September following a tour of duty off Alaskan coastal waters. The ship is designed and outfitted for conducting coastal hydrographic surveys in support of NOAA's nautical program. The ship supports high-precision on-shore surveys primarily in Alaskan coastal waters.

This educational and informative tour offers a wonderful opportunity to learn about an important Commerce Department agency operating out of our Puget Sound area. NOAA warns of dangerous weather, charts our seas and skies, guides our use and protection of ocean and coastal resources, and conducts research to improve our understanding and stewardship of the environment. Members are welcome to bring children and grandchildren.

LeMay Car Collection Exclusive Tour

BMA has arranged an exclusive tour of the LeMay Museum. Trained docents will guide us through the Marymount Academy, temporary home to some 400 cars in the Harold LeMay collection.

Harold and Nancy LeMay amassed the largest privately owned collection of automobiles, motorcycles, and related memorabilia in the world. At its peak, the LeMay Collection numbered in excess of 3,000 vehicles and thousands of artifacts and was listed in the *Guinness Book of World Records* as the largest privately owned collection in the world. Impressive if accomplished by a king; awesome when accomplished by a local businessman from Tacoma.

The LeMay Museum was chartered in 1998 to secure, preserve, and interpret the valuable LeMay Collection, along with additional vehicles and artifacts that it may acquire, in order to explore the broad themes of American mobility and lifestyle in an instructive and entertaining manner. The museum began a national campaign to raise funds to create America's Car Museum in 2004; the museum will open its new facility in late 2008.
