## Health and Welfare

### Falls—Let's Prevent Them!

The odds of falling after age 65 are one in three. As you get older, you are more likely to fall as a result of age-related physical changes and medical conditions and the medications that you take to treat them. Most falls are not serious, but they are the leading cause of injury and injury-related death among older adults.

Prevention of falls starts with a visit to your health care provider for a physical examination. Review with them the medications you are taking. Have you fallen before or had dizzy spells? Could your health conditions cause a fall?

Physical activity, tai chi, and water exercise improve your strength, balance, flexibility, and coordination. If you have an inner ear problem, there are vestibular medical rehabilitation programs available at most hospitals.

Wear sensible footwear and avoid floppy slippers and slick-soled shoes that could catch on a carpet or stairs. Remove home hazards such as boxes, electrical cords, loose rugs, and clutter on the floor that could cause you to trip. Use non-slip floor wax and immediately clean up spills.

Keep non-glare lighting at night. Glow-in-the-dark light switches and night lights are very useful. A flashlight should be handy for those power outages that occur during storms.

Assistive devices around tubs, showers, toilets, and stairways can help. Use non-slip treads on stairs and keep kitty litter handy for use on frozen outside stairs.

Remember to take plenty of Calcium and Vitamin D. Lastly, if you do fall, try to tuck and roll! ❖
