Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center Presentation

Jo Henderson, manager of the Public Health Sciences Prevention Clinic for Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center, will present on the kinds of studies available, the kinds of research benefits reached, and how volunteers will be used for this important work.

Many of today's treatments are based on results of clinical trials, including preventing breast and childhood cancers. Action studies, such as quitting smoking, exercising, or taking medications, focus on learning whether taking certain medicines, vitamins, minerals, or food supplements can prevent cancer. The overall topic of cancer research and prevention studies will be discussed.

Study highlights include, new study of targeted therapies for breast cancer, ultrasound expertise in the diagnosis of ovarian cancer, and thalidomide of elderly multiple myeloma patients.
