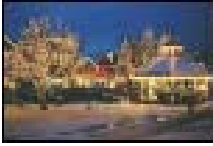
## Check It Out

## Health and Welfare

### Universal Health Care USA

Do you take an interest in your own health? Only 20 percent of insured Americans have recommended preventive examinations done during annual physical examinations reported in the September issue of *Annals of Internal Medicine*. The cost was 7.8 billion dollars for 64 million Americans who had the annual examinations. If all who were eligible for the exams, this would take up 41 percent of the available time primary care physicians had available during regular work hours.

A new plan is needed for the nation. National expenditure for health care is reaching two trillion dollars per year. Administrative overhead costs is nearly 30 percent or \$600 plus billion dollars. Almost 50 percent of costs are paid for through taxes. Thus we are paying for half with tax dollars and are halfway toward a national health care service. We have all heard the political pundits with their plans if elected to office. In just the last ten years the number of uninsured has gone from 37 million to 43 million.

It is interesting that all other nations around the world have a national health care program for their citizens. It is paid for by taxes and contributions. Many plans including HMO, preferred providers, and other insurance health plans have failed to control costs and deliver services to all the population. The business models do not work because there is no good supply, demand, or competitive market for health care services.

We have all experienced outstanding improvement in diagnosis and treatment in the last 50 years. The costs for this have been high. Yet the longevity and quality of life have improved for most of us. Our retirement years for most of us is good. We have yet to come up with the value and cost of one human life. Our demands and expectations are very high for health care services. The nation has to solve the cost, services, safety, and quality of life issues. This remains a big challenge for us all.

Part of the answer will come from the balance between preventive services and diagnosis and treatment services. Most will come from our taking charge of our own health and learning how to stay healthy. The costs of supersizing our diets is going to be important! ❖
