Is Obesity Contagious?

A recent article in the *New England Journal of Medicine* by Dr. N.A.Christakis surprisingly suggests that you may be overweight if your friends are obese. The 22-year study (from 1971 to 2003) enrolled 12,067 persons. The researchers carefully identified family and close friends of the study group including friends of friends by three degrees of separation. They found that a person's chance of becoming obese was increased by 57 percent if he or she had a friend who was obese. This is also true for adult siblings, if one was obese the other siblings had a 40 percent chance of becoming obese. For husbands and wives, it was increased by 37 percent.

When the sample was restricted to same-sex friendships (87 percent of the total), the probability of obesity increased by 71 percent if the friend became obese. Among sisters the risk was 67 percent, and for brothers it increased to 44 percent. The chance of obesity did not extend to neighbors.

The obesity of a friend living far away correlated as strongly with an individual's obesity as did having an obese friend living close by.

What appears to be happening, investigators said, is that obese persons change what they see as appropriate body size, and they come to think it is okay to be bigger, as those among them are bigger, and this sensibility spreads. All this points to a direct causal relationship; it is not just a genetic association, but social networks that have just as important an influence on the risk of developing obesity. It is not what you eat but who your friends are.

Perhaps network phenomena might be exploited to spread positive health behaviors. After all, if obesity is contagious, thinness could be, too. Network phenomena affect all aspects of biology and medicine, and we may be entering a new era of medical practice called network medicine. ❖
