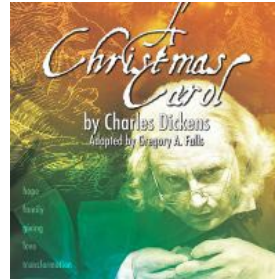

### Sitting

You are probably sitting reading this newsletter. Most of our awake time is taken up with sitting. We sit for most of our meals. We sit to watch TV. We sit at a computer. We sit in airplanes, buses, and cars. We sit while visiting and talking on the phone. Parks are a great place for walking; however we sit on park benches. Going to a party! Most of the time we seek a chair on which to sit

Lying down is better as the circulation to our legs is better than sitting. Leg cramps are often a problem brought on by sitting. It is important to move your legs to prevent blood clots in the deep veins of the leg. Getting up and walking is also important, so next time you are sitting think about getting up and walking. If you can't get up and walk, rock your ankles and legs to exercise your calf and thigh muscles. Exercise is great, just do it! ❖
