BMA proudly presents Lunch with William E. (Bill) Boeing, Jr., the son of the founder of The Boeing Company. Mr. Boeing had the unique opportunity to see aviation history being made as his father built an airplane company. During the 1920s and 1930s Mr. Boeing Jr. was a part of our aviation legacy as he and his mother were some of the first passengers on the Company's very first production passenger airplane, the Model 40A. In 1928 he also cut the ribbon opening Seattle's Boeing Field. Later he became a pilot, a successful real estate developer and business entrepreneur in the Pacific Northwest as well as having a pioneering role in bringing helicopter aviation to Alaska.

Today Mr. Boeing is active with Seattle's Museum of Flight, is a Museum 'Pathfinder' and recently was presented with the Museum's inaugural Red Barn Heritage Award.
